For that purpose, they counted with the contribution of a student of Professor Susser and with a researcher of the group of Professor Laurenti, who wrote the obituaries included in this edition. Maria Helena de Mello Prado Jorge, who developed her scientific activities in partnership with Professor Laurenti, also exalts his technical and human qualities, emphasizing, among other contributions, the influence he has played in the construction and consolidation of the excellent standards showed in the Brazilian information systems.
